Re: Clifton Station/Garibaldi-Meucci Museum


Dear President Bianco and Chief Jezycki:

They had journeyed to Staten Island to explore the iconic Garibaldi-Meucci Museum, and as you will read they had a wonderful time. However, they were quite surprised that there was no commemorative plaque or sign at the Clifton Station of the Staten Island Railway to inform visitors that they had reached the disembarkation point for the museum.


